

SUMMARY OF PARISH COUNCIL MEETING HELD ON 22nd FEBRUARY 2024


At their last meeting on 22nd February, Councillors discussed a number of important issues affecting the Parish. The Blickling half-marathon had taken place on 4th February and thanks to liaison between the chairman and the organisers of the event, minimal disruption had been caused to residents.

There had been a noticeable increase in traffic passing through the village since traffic lights had been installed on the A140 because of the construction of a compound associated with wind farm cable installation work. Speeding through the village was still an issue and data from the Speed Awareness Monitor (SAM) was to be analysed to provide evidence of this on-going problem. A number of Councillors had attended a drop-in session held by Vattenfall to find out more about the wind farm project and how it could be expected to impact the parish in the next few years. Work in 2024 will largely be preparatory before extensive cable laying begins. The Council will be kept updated by Vattenfall. The Council received a report that two grant applications had been made on behalf of the

Friends of St Lawrence Church to fund restoration work as the structure of the church is considered to be "vulnerable". The outcome of one of the applications would be made known on 14 March 2024.

And finally. the next business meeting of the Parish Council will be on Thursday 23rd May followed on FRIDAY 24th MAY at 6.30pm by the ANNUAL PARISH MEETING. The latter is an opportunity for residents to find out about the work of the parish council and have your say. It will be held in St. Lawrence Church. Report of the Ordinary meeting of Erpingham with Calthorpe Parish Council Wednesday 13th March

In the chair Rob Goodliffe welcomed all those present; apologies from the District Councillor were received and there were no declarations of interest. The Council approved minutes of the Ordinary Meeting of the Council held on January 8th 2024, and these were signed. Under matters arising about Eagle Road Norfolk County Council had indicated that their review would bring about a reversal of priority; the Clerk would canvass member's views before responding to NCC. Following a request from residents the Clerk had asked NCC to inspect School Road for potholes. On footpaths - Erpingham FP5 – the path issue raised were being addressed by Norfolk County Council, which had advised that the footbridge over the Bure (Blickling FP19 to Erpingham FP3) is closed. The path from Eagle Road to the recreation ground is being followed up by the District Councillor. The bus shelter bike rack was in progress with the Clerk awaiting permission from the landowner and a further quote for the work.

Under planning the Council had no objection., and the application had been approved to the amendments to design at 12 Jubilee Close; the field off Banningham Road, for change of use from agricultural to dog walking/training had been approved. On other planning business it was understood that the telecoms mast application would now be considered on March 21st..In his finance report the Clerk had contacted the MUGA group and the Football Club for their 23-24 contributions, which had been received. Letters to the bank would be presented for signature (payment amendment HMRC PAYE payment). The Council approved grant payments to N Norfolk Community Transport, Norfolk CAB, Erpingham PCC, Friends of Calthorpe Church, as well as the Clerk's expenses, the Norfolk Parish and Training Support subscription, electricity and the Clerk's salary.

On play area business the Council heard that regular checks had been carried out; the record book was signed by the Chairman. On maintenance and repairs the Council agreed that the Clerk would liaise with a play area specialist/ builder to arrange a site meeting so quotes and options to be explored. The Council considered further the interface of the Parish Council with the Village Hall Committee. The Council agreed that a member would attend the Village Hall Committee meetings every other month, taking it in turns. The Clerk would forward the agenda each time as a reminder.

In members' reports the Council heard about alternative 'phone options for those losing analogue service. There was a reminder about the MP's e-meeting on the digital switchover. There was report on SAM signs, SNAP meeting, MUGA inspections and the defibrillator pad replacement. The Clerk reported that he was acquiring a framed photograph of the King for display in the Village Hall. The next meeting would be on Wednesday May 8th 2024. In open meeting the issue of poor or no broadband was raised as an issue in the village. With no other business the meeting closed at 20.55.




